

New Resources for Transitioning from Birth to Three

The [Local Educational Agency Transition Requirements for Late Referrals to Birth to 3 Programs resource](#) provides information related to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requirement that a referral be sent by the Birth to 3 Program to the Local Educational Agency (LEA) not less than 90 days prior to the child's 3rd birthday. The scenarios listed in this resource outline the circumstances when the LEA may receive the referral less than 90 days prior to the child's 3rd birthday and guides the LEA regarding how to proceed with the comprehensive special education evaluation within an expected timeframe. The [Transition Planning Conference \(TPC\) Conversation Guide to Support Families Moving from a Birth to Three Program \(IFSP\) to School Age Special Education Services \(IEP\)](#) provides information about the transition planning conference to support the family in understanding the transition process and help make the transition from the Birth to 3 Program to the school district special education services as seamless as possible for the child and family.

Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) for Adolescents: An Introduction to Theory, Family Engagement, and Growing Motivation

Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) for Adolescents: An Introduction to Theory, Family Engagement, and Growing Motivation - SAVE THE DATE

Workshop Description: Dialectical Behavior Therapy for Adolescents (DBT-A) is an evidence-based treatment designed to help teens struggling with intensely dysregulated emotions and behaviors. Common problems targeted in DBT-A include self-harm, suicidal ideation and actions, violent outbursts, substance use, school refusal, and many other similar behaviors. This training will introduce a theoretical lens for understanding these emotions and behaviors, and an overview of how DBT-A treats these struggles.

Indicator 8 Family Engagement Survey

Each year, the WI Department of Public Instruction (DPI) requires 20% of Wisconsin school districts to take part in the Federal Indicator 8 Family Engagement Survey data collection as part of the district's self-assessment. The survey is offered to all parents of children ages 3-17 who are receiving special education services and support through an Individualized Education Program (IEP). Indicator 8 identifies the ***percentage of parents with a child receiving special education services who report that schools facilitated parent involvement as a means of improving services and results for children with disabilities***. The survey is confidential. DPI will use the survey results to improve services to children and youth with IEPs and their families.
